



Latin American and European Alliance at the United Nations for a 2030 Feminist Agenda

- Over 700 organizations from around twenty Latin American and European countries started working together to introduce the feminist perspective in the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- Within the framework of the UN CSW62, this meeting has paved the way for putting Sexual and Reproductive Rights into the center of Women's Human Rights defense

New York City, March 14, 2018 – **Over 700 women's organizations from around twenty Latin American and European** countries have paved the way to introduce the feminist perspective into the 2030 Agenda and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). This alliance arises as one of the goals of the 2030FeministAgenda Action Program led by [Creación Positiva](#) and [Associació de Planificació Familiar de Catalunya i Balears \(APFCIB\)](#), two catalan organizations advocating for Sexual and Reproductive Rights as the core of Women's Human Rights. This above-mentioned Action Program has the support of the Catalan Agency for Development Cooperation.

Representatives of organizations gathered in New York City during the Sixty-second session of the UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW62) have agreed on the main themes of the advocacy action document. These key work themes are based on **sexual education from a feminist perspective; contraception and abortion; non-criminalization of LGBTI communities and the fight against violence against women**. According to Montserrat Pineda, Creación Positiva's representative, "we aim to offer a dialogue forum to define a joint political position to directly influence on an international agenda that is currently taking steps backwards in the defense of women's rights". Also, this Action Program consider that "the 2030 Agenda will only become a Feminist Agenda if we work all together on an alliance that will contribute to a new global governance with civil society organizations" as stated by Silvia Aldavert, APFCIB's coordinator.

From now on a consensus document to establish advocacy, participation and global leadership actions to introduce the feminist perspective in the defense of women's rights will be a must. This alliance will work at a global and local basis defining tools to have Governments introducing the feminist perspective on their SDGs Plans.

The 2030 Feminist Agenda aims to be a meeting platform for organizations, groups, networks and social movements sharing that the defense of Sexual and Reproductive Rights, Women's Human Rights and Feminism are at the top of agendas for action and daily advocacy, incorporating the feminist and human rights perspective. The Agenda has already worked on intersectional feminist SDGs as an alternative of the SDGs adopted by the United Nations. Feminists SDGs are part of a critical analysis proving the link between each of the SDGs, Women's Human Rights and Sexual and Reproductive Rights.
